On Friday 3 May we received approval from the DfE and MoD to proceed with setting up a Combined Cadet Force (Army) unit at Brannel School under the Cadet Expansion Programme (CEP). The MoD-sponsored Cadet Forces are widely recognised as one of the most successful uniformed youth organisations in the UK. By providing a safe place for young people to develop through undertaking challenging activities, underpinned by the values and standards of the Armed Forces, the Cadet Forces continue to make a significant contribution by changing many young people's lives for the better. Formal feedback from both the DfE and MoD on our application was extremely positive: "Schools wishing to establish a cadet unit are required to meet specified criteria, and a key factor in the decision process is the standard of the application. It is clear from the high quality of your submission that a lot of time and effort has gone into providing us with the information needed to assess your suitability to host a cadet unit."





Clare is a former student of Oxford University where she studied an English degree before spending much of her career in the Creative Arts. Her name came to the fore in 2021 when her novel 'Zed and the Cormorants' was published, breaking through into major online retailers, available as a paperback, e-book and audiobook.

The day started with the entirety of Year 8 spending a lesson in the Assembly Hall as Clare discussed how she turned her initial idea into a popular published story.

After the assembly, Clare led a workshop with selected students to work on creative writing and character development. The workshop focussed on positive associations, with students asked to write about a food they love, using as many descriptive words as possible whilst also considering their memories associated with foods (e.g. treats from grandparents, beach days etc).

Students were then required to swap their foods and memories with other students in the class, mixing up ideas and applying them to their own fictional characters.






Mrs. Roper - ELSA

Miss. Gray – Marathon Inspiration


